With over 96 years of history at Ohio Wesleyan University, the Ohio Epsilon Chapter of Sigma Phi Epsilon Fraternity takes pride in promoting continually the ideal of the Balanced Man through our chapter programming which focuses on Sound Mind and Sound Body activities. Our chapter remains diligent in its' pursuit of excellence in the classroom, success in intramural and varsity athletics, a strong presence in philanthropy and community service activities, and a full calendar of brotherhood events. The brothers of Sigma Phi Epsilon would like to update you on some recent accomplishments achieved by the chapter. 

To honor the memory of our President Jakob F. Von Der Vellen, who is pictured on the left in the photo above died in a car accident March 16. Ohio Wesleyan held a memorial service honoring Jake on March 30th in Grey Chapel.

President Rock Jones began the memorial service and said "The news of Jake's death was shocking one week ago, and it is still shocking today. We gather today with hearts heavy, questions with no answers, and, as the apostle Paul said, we gather with 'sighs too deep for words.' Jake's impact on OWU had

already been enormous through his outreach in service and role as a mentor.

Sig Ep sophomores Greg Hock and Jason Lonnemann spoke on behalf of the brothers to bid Jake farewell.

"He was the most dedicated and passionate person I knew and I am honored to speak on behalf of my brothers. Jake had a passion for Sig Ep and kept thinking of new ideas to make it the best it could be. He loved his little brother (from Big Brother Big Sister). He taught us how to be an honest man, brother and

friend. I think I speak for all of the brothers when I say we miss him, but are grateful for the time we had with him." We honor Jake by leaving him listed on the Executive Committee as President. Nick Ehlers is now the current President and Brandon Proctor is the new VP of Programming. Jake may have left us too soon, but he will never be forgotten.

In 2011 the brothers decided to choose the Alzheimer's Association located in Columbus to be the beneficiaries of any money raised. We raised \$1,700 and were featured on Columbus news. Next year we hope to make a bigger splash and raise even more money for the Alzheimer's Association!
